As I peruse the Bay Area looking for interesting places to listen to blues, I luckily received an invitation from singers **Earnestine Barze** and **Wanda Diamond.** They brought me to two old school classics in Oakland: Eli's Mile High Club on MLK Boulevard and Everette and Jones's Q's Lounge on Broadway. Earnestine was jam leader for the Monday Night Blues Jam series at Eli's and told me "get there around 6" to get good parking close by. A fabulously skilled band backed awesome singers all night at Eli's, including stalwart regulars, Fillmore Slim, who performed his new CD "Sons of The Seven Sisters." Ninety plus years YOUNG Nat **Bolden**, who duets with powerhouse singer **Sharon Davis**, was also there--the real deal here folks. Earnestine is a very special entertainer, with a hot wardrobe and a voice unique in the way she uses phrasing. She sent goosebumps throughout the crowd, letting us know we were hearing the BLUES. Wanda Diamond was sitting in with The Caravan who host at Q's every Saturday night. Parking is handy at the garage over Yoshi's. The BBO there is awesome, and the only grease is on the stage. Ribs, links, beans and cornbread along with great voices all night tell me we are well taken care of in the Bay Area with venues worthy of the most jaded tourists and locals alike. Treat yourself to these two historic gems. Everett & Jones Barbeque will have a plague on Oakland's Walk of Fame. "The Music They Played on 7th Street, Oakland Walk of **Fame"** pays tribute to the great musicians, club owners, record companies, related independent businesses and others that put 7th Street on the map as a top entertainment destination. A total of 88 brass plagues the number of keys on a piano — will be embedded into both sides of the sidewalk along 7th Street, between Center and Wood Streets. The plagues will honor those that helped earn 7th Street the nickname "Harlem of the West." **Ronnie Stewart** is the man behind this project and it took him years to see it become a reality.

With the death of bluesman **Ron Thompson** and tireless promoter **Jack Cohen**, I have been reminded how precious our existence is. I appreciate our community more and more. With blessings, we will survive and enjoy a future filled with great music. I am also looking forward to embracing some very special programs and worthy causes. Last Saturday I was invited to attend the **7th Annual "Girls Got the Blues"** fundraiser for Next Door Solutions to Domestic Violence at Tabard Theatre in San Jose. Parking is convenient in an adjacent city garage which is free with a validation from the theatre or from the many fine restaurants that line the street. We took a fun ride in the freight elevator which brought us to a large room with a very long bar, tiered soft seating, and a gigantic stage that circles out well into the room, bringing the performers very close and intimate. Great lighting and sound complete a very cushy setting where we were offered spare seats in the VIP section by a generous patron, Judy Marlin. The show was very well done with fine musicianship and excellent vocals from the special quests. What was even more impressive is how dedicated the organizers are, how hard they work, and how deeply involved they are in their cause. They found a fabulous venue, negotiated a big savings, booked a superb well-rehearsed line-up, and managed to pack the place with an enthusiastic, generous crowd that loved every minute of the afternoon. Congratulations to Event Coordinator, Marianne **Adoradio**, Executive Director **Esther Peralez Dieckmann**, and Development Director, **Beth Williams**. They have inspired me to try a few of these worthy shows ourselves--volunteers?

Aki's jam was moved since January of 2017 to The Poor House Bistro, replacing Aki's Mojo Lounge jam. The house band does a one-hour opening set. Aki provides a nice backline of instruments including two guitar amps, a bass amp, a harp amp, and a drum kit. The sound system is good. The Poor House is known for its casual, family like atmosphere. If you get hungry you can just walk up the stairs and get a delicious meal for a reasonable price. They also have a full bar. Jammers are asked not to bring in equipment but to use what is provided. It makes the jam much easier to run. Aki has been running jams for over a decade and knows exactly how to make it work. His guests are often heavyweights like Kid Andersen, Steve Freund, and many others.

Ron Thompson, the great bluesman, slipped into a coma on February 15th, 2020 due to a hypoglycemic seizure and never regained consciousness. According to those close to Ron he was in no pain and did not suffer. His passing was very peaceful. He was 66 years old.

Bio:

Not many living blues musicians can say they have performed with and recorded for legends like John Lee Hooker, Big Mama Thornton, Tina Turner, Luther Tucker, Jimmy McCracklin, Pee Wee Crayton, Carla Thomas, Booker T. Jones, Percy Mayfield, Etta James, B.B. King, and Jimmy Reed. Ron Thompson can, and that's just the beginning!


Ron Thompson is a legendary rhythm and blues guitarist and master keyboardist whose career began in the rough and tumble world of East San Francisco Bay nightclubs and bars in the early 1970's. After serving as John Lee Hooker's bandleader for seven years, Thompson went on to form his own group, Ron Thompson and His Resisters. Ron performed at the Jazz and Blues Sessions in Berne, Switzerland, and he has electrified stages in Poland, Mexico, Belize, and many other parts of the world.

Ron Thompson was honored by the City of San Francisco for his decades of musical contributions. By official proclamation of Mayor Gavin Newsom, September 5, 2007, was declared "Ron Thompson Day in San Francisco."

Ron's extensive roster of awards over the years include two Bay Area Music Awards (Bammies), the Colorado Blues Society's Lifetime Achievement Award, induction into the Blues Hall of Fame, and others. Ron's "Resistor Twister" album was nominated for a Grammy in 1987. In the early 1980's, Ron met Mick Fleetwood (Fleetwood Mac) and the two became musical partners

and close friends. Ron and Mick formed the band, Mick Fleetwood's Blue Whale. Blue Whale still occasionally performs when Ron and Mick's busy schedules permit.

Thompson's extensive discography includes nine of his own albums, much studio work, and several European anthologies. Not only has he shared the stage with numerous blues luminaries, Thompson has performed or recorded with such musical greats as Fleetwood Mac, Chris Isaak, Carlos Santana, Bonnie Raitt, Tina Turner, Elvin Bishop, Bill Medley, Huey Lewis, Dr. John, songwriter Bobby Womak, The Fabulous Thunderbirds, Robert Cray Band, Z.Z. Top, and many others.

Ron Thompson released his first solo and acoustic album "Resonator" in 2007. All the tracks except two were written by Ron and display his versatility—from bluesy to spiritual to jazzy instrumental. "Resonator" was greeted with critical acclaim the world over. Not only did "Resonator" demonstrate Ron's ability to perform as a solo artist, it showcased his songwriting prowess and mastery of many diverse genres.

"WEE WILLIE"

The KRSH Backyard Concert series is located in a grassy nook hidden in a corner of Santa Rosa, where the radio station operates from a caboose. Soul singer Wee Willie Walker performed there August 9th 2018, backed by the Anthony Paule Soul Orchestra.

During the 1960s, with the group the Val-Dons, Walker got his nickname from fellow bandmember, Timothy Eason. "He hung that on me and it stuck. I tried to get rid of it, but it didn't work," Walker says during our meeting in Napa this past summer (in _). His record label from 1965-1968, Goldwax, put it the name on all his records without asking him. Upset at first, Walker came to realize, later, that people recognized his name more frequently with the word "Wee". "I guess that's who I am," Willie thought.

The Val-Dons (Wee Willi Walker's first band) formed when Walker met Timothy Eason in a laundromat where they began harmonizing on the spot to a tune of Jerry Butler's, "He Don't Love You." Walker told me about the laundromat's "great acoustics." The Val-Dons had a run of three years, marking Walker's move from gospel to secular music.

Born December 21, 1941 near Memphis, Tennessee, Walker started his career there as a teenager, singing gospel with the "Redemption Harmonizers," who Walker called "mostly kids." They traveled in

a Cadillac for summertime shows in the mid-to-late '50's. Arriving in Minneapolis in 1959, he fell in love with the city's beauty and tranquility. Walker lived there until his death on November 19th 2019. Some gospel friends were recording secular music for Goldwax in Memphis. The label, with no studio, operated from the back of a drug store. They had a piano, and Walker sang them a couple of songs. They signed him, making him the first black artist in Minnesota to record for a national label.

Contrary to the label's promises, Walker was only given three songs to record, accomplished at two legendary locales – Sam Phillips' Sun Studio in Memphis and Rick Hall's Fame Studios in Muscle Shoals, Alabama.

Walker never saw a royalty check from Goldwax. Instead, they gave him 50 copies of one of his songs to sell himself, to record stores. "I made \$50," Walker says.

After the Val-Dons, Walker formed the band "Willie and the Bees" with Willie Murphy. Murphy thought Walker's voice sounded like a bumble bee. His current R&B group is Willie Walker and the We "R", extant since 2004. Between 2004-2007, Walker also performed in Japan and Switzerland with a Stax-type band, the Butanes.

Late in life, Walker has gained national notoriety. His album, "If Nothing Ever Changes," recorded with top San Francisco Bay Area artists (Greaseland Studios), gained him four Blues Music Award nominations in 2015.

After connecting with prominent guitarist Anthony Paule at a Porretta Soul Festival in Italy, he's been touring extensively with Paule's Soul Orchestra (until his death in December of 2019). Their 2017 release, "After a While," represents classic soul at its best. Walker received five BMA nominations in 2018 for that album.

When asked about the best part of his notoriety, Walker says, "The presence of the people I'm playing for. You can feel their energy – it's like wow!"



S.E. WILLIS AND THE WILLING

"Too Much Love" / Mr. Suchensuch Records



Multi-instrumentalist, vocalist and song-writer S.E. (Steve) Willis has been making great music for over fifty years as part of any number of internationally known bands and has seven of his own recordings to show for it.

His latest solo shot, "Too Much Love" will dazzle listeners by way of his breadth of Americana chops, whether within the genre of Blues, zydeco, country western and then some.

Playing with an inspired band, including several stellar West Coast guest artists, Willis (who's played with Elvin Bishop for almost two decades,) has created a compelling effort, from first cut to last.

Featuring eleven tracks over 44-minutes, the album was put down at recording ace David Landon's Whip Records, Christoffer "Kid" Andersen's Greaseland Records, and Willis' own Mr. Suchensuch studio, all of which are to be headquartered in the greater Bay Area.

The production throughout the disc is clean and extremely present. Andersen (of Rick Estrin and the Nightcats fame,) assumes several duties, among them engineering on several tracks, as well as contributing tasteful acoustic and riveting electric guitar work.

"Turn Back" embellishes a cool New Orleans groove along with Willis' yearning and deeply felt vocals. Listen for Lisa Leuschner's background vocals here. She is a revelation. Master keyboardist Willis turns over lead vocals to marvelous drummer Bobby Cochran (Elvin Bishop band) on three tracks, one of which, "I Sure Don't Know Who Does," co-stars powerhouse contralto & rising star, Marina Crouse.

The insanely fun instrumental, "Apocalypto" bounces along with Nancy Wright's fluid and infectious sax work. "My Happy Home" and "Honky Tonk Romance" showcase Willis' country-western leanings. His harmonica playing and wizened vocals on both, along with Wright singing background vocals on the latter could melt the grime off a barstool.

"Crawl Off and Die" showcases the multi-talented Willis on accordion along with his strong, yet plaintive vocal. "Let That Be The Reason" has a marvelously funky beat with great leads and fills by

sax-woman Wright, and excellent all-around guitarist Danny Caron (Charles Brown, Marcia Ball, Clifton Chenier, John Lee Hooker, among many others.) The mid-tempo but upbeat title track showcases Willis harmonica & accordion prowess, plus a jaunty vocal by Cochran.

Must give major props to longtime Bay Area bass player, Ruth Davies (Charles Brown, Elvis Costello and a ton of others,) who throughout is the solid sender within the rhythm section.

In all, a truly enjoyable romp, and excellent showcase for S.E's prominent place on the national scene.

BISCUITS AND BLUES UPDATE

COURT FINALLY STEPS IN AFTER 10 MONTHS AND GRANTS AN INJUNCTION AGAINST JACK IN THE BOX!

A Jack in the Box restaurant in San Francisco's Union Square neighborhood has been ordered by a San Francisco Superior Court judge to fix its faulty plumbing, which for several months last year leaked water and feces onto Biscuits and Blues, the old-school music venue below it that has remained closed for almost a year. Jack in The Box is now closed at that location and we assume they are repairing the leaks.

The order is part of a temporary injunction issued by the court on Monday, February 10^{th,} 2020. It comes roughly 10 months after Steven Suen was forced to close the club. Suen has been seeking justice from the courts for almost one year. According to the filing, Jack in the Box "must stop any leaks from the refrigerators and freezers up to and including unplugging the appliances." It goes on to say Biscuits and Blues "continues to suffer irreparable harm" while the 24-hour burger joint operates.



This can be a victory! We wait to see if Jack in the Box will do the right thing and be a good neighbor to Biscuits and Blues. After all the owner of this JITB has 22 more burger joints, but there is only one authentic blues club like Biscuits and Blues in San Francisco. JITB is making repairs.

"It's just incredibly frustrating to see what has been happening. There's just so many people that care about this place. You've been seeing honest, hardworking people being stonewalled by a big corporation."
